This is the **final announcement** of the 2nd International Conference of the International Society of Transference Focused psychotherapy.

The Conference

The Conference will be held on **September 2012, 29th and 30th**, following the International Conference on Borderline Personality (ESSPD) in Amsterdam. One could attend this conference first and then attend the ISTFP Conference. But one could also attend the ISTFP Conference by it self, as there is little overlap.

Please find the **Scientific Program attached**: the **Conference Opening Dinner** is on Saturday and the **Conference** itself is on Sunday. You are very welcome to both. You will also find a **Registration Form**.

The conference location

Amsterdam is a relatively small city. Its heart - the canals and inner city - dates from the fifteenth till seventeenth century. The Opening Dinner and Conference will both be held on one of the canals, at **The Rode Hoed ('Red Hat')**, at the Keizersgracht. Until 1629 there was a hat factory on this location; then a Remonstrant church in hiding was built here. Currently it is used for cultural lectures, television shows as well as political and ethical debates. It has a warm and focused atmosphere and we are happy to be able to use it. Accommodation and transportation

Restaurants are found and booked through <u>www.seatme.nl</u>. Students with limited funds can notify us and we will try to find places to stay with colleagues and friends for them.

Main means of **transportation** in the city is either the bicycle or public transport (tram, bus, taxies). For public transportation you can buy single tickets, but it is cheaper to buy a general transportation card, called OV *Chipcard*, (at cigar or newspaper stores) and get it charged there. On entering and leaving the tram or bus one needs to scan the card. The nicest way to move around and see the city is on a bike. Renting a bicycle is possible at many locations, see <u>http://macbike.nl</u> for example. In Holland we drive on the right hand side. Please be aware, because the traffic may be hectic.
